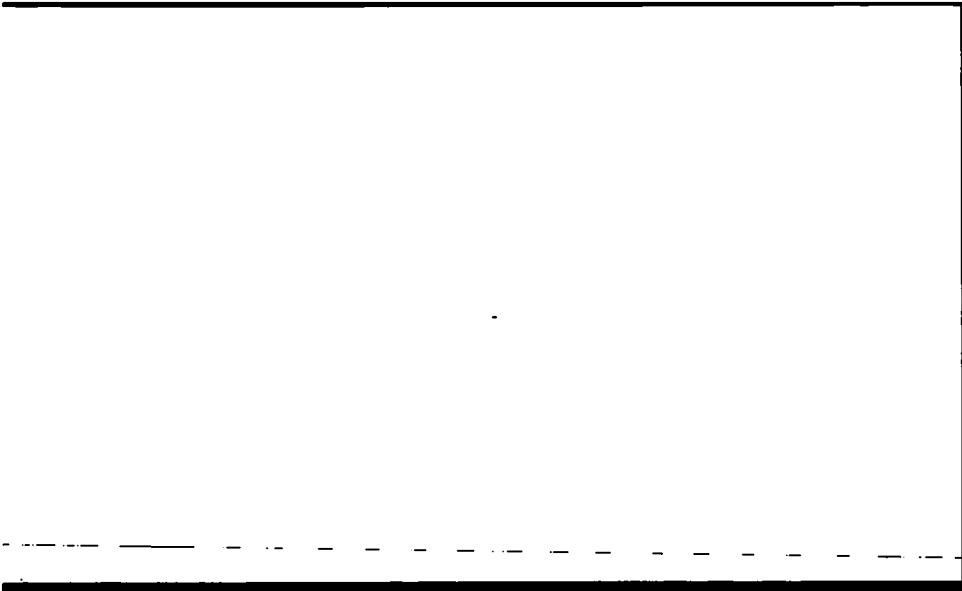

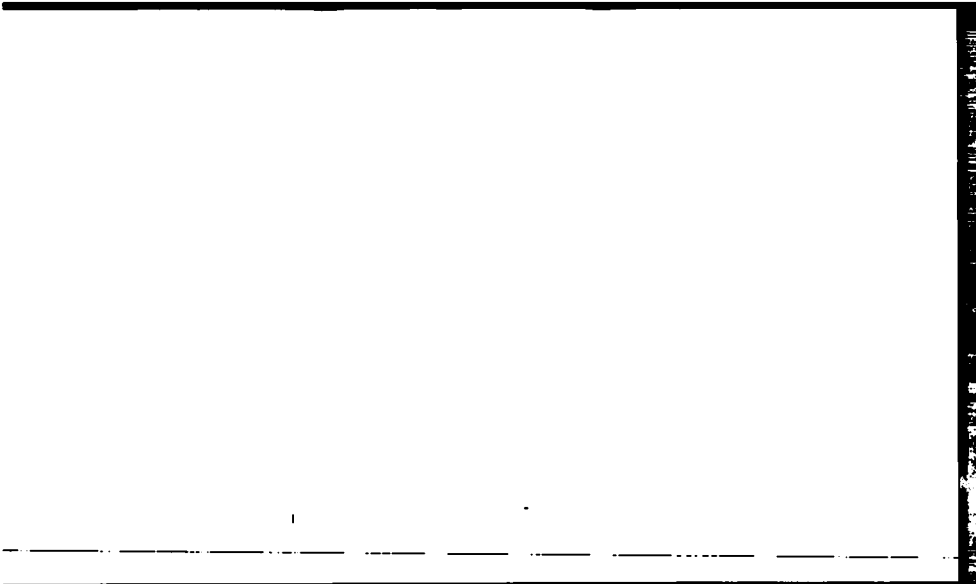

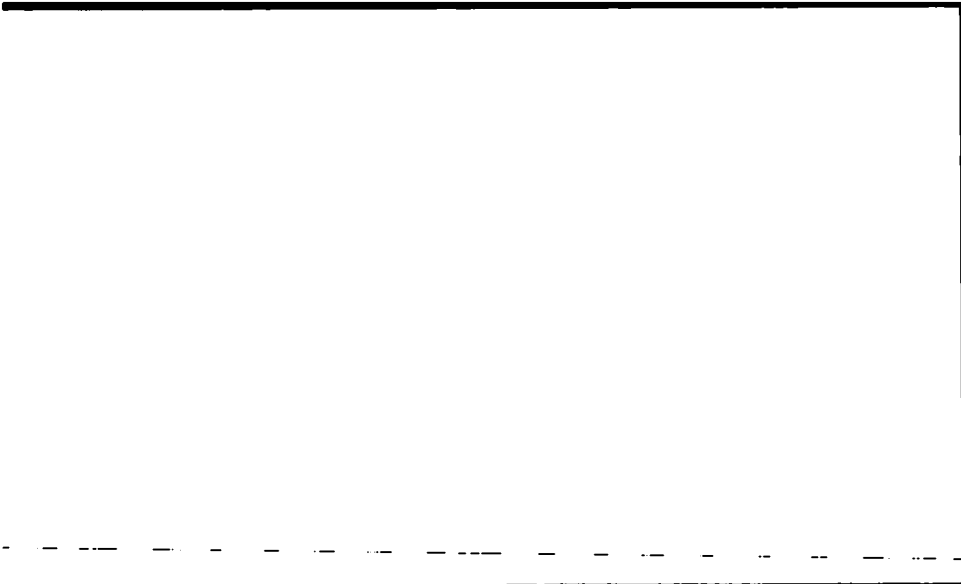


SONGS: THE CAISSONS GO ROLLING ALONG

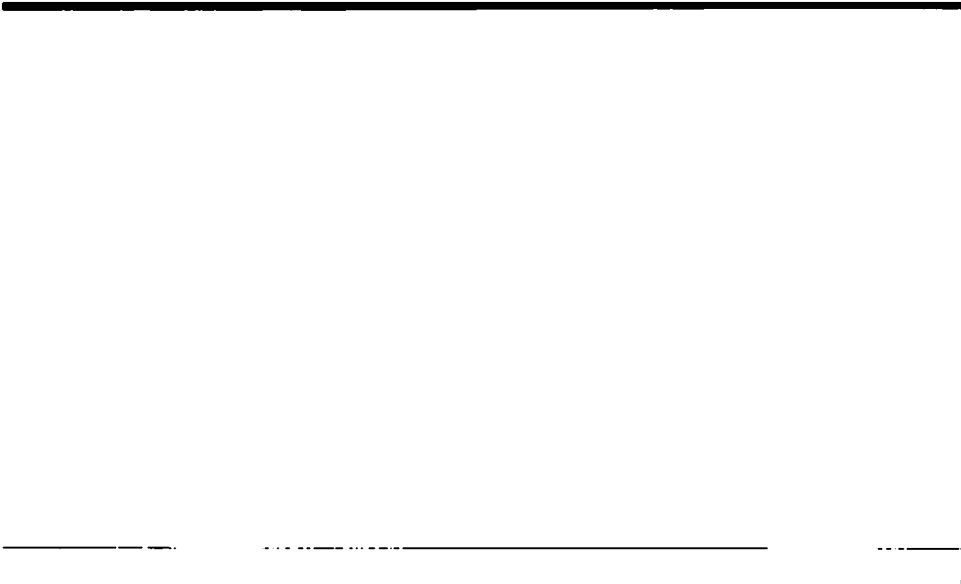

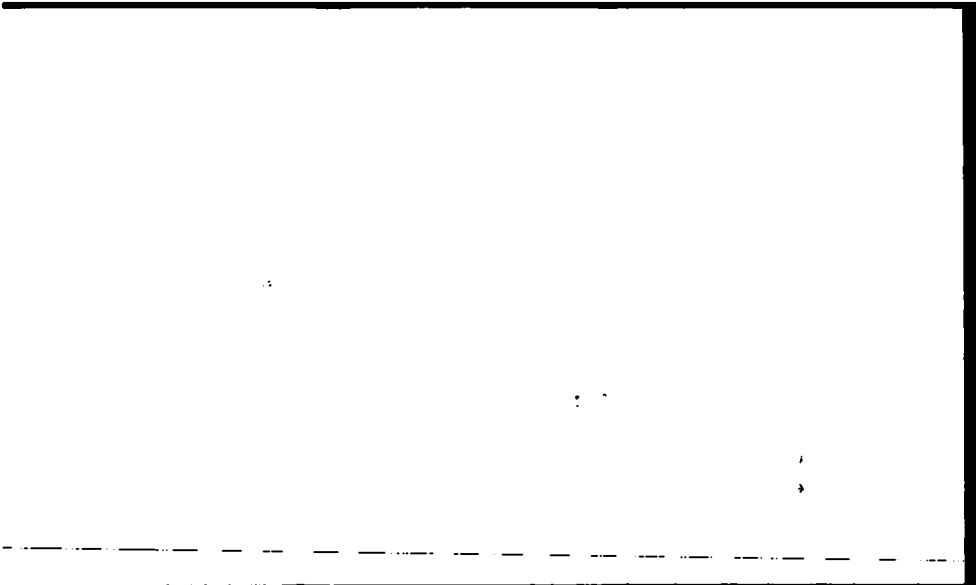
