5. Except the data contained on the first four lines and that relating to battle casualties and physical disability, this statement would be denied to persons who might perpetrate frauds upon the Government, as otherwise information leakage might injure the soldier.
4. Except as hereinbefore provided, all persons seeking information relative to the military and medical histories of the soldier should be denied information from, or access to, his statement of service except as a basis for the prosecution of a claim against the soldier or his dependents, and will not be made public nor communicated to any individual who may use it directly or by said society or association, and will not be made public nor communicated to any individual who may use it directly or indirectly and philanthropic societies and associations wherein it is known positively that the information is to be used exclusively of patriotic and charitable organizations to their rule may be made in the case of officials of the Army, who is the custodian of the official records of the Armed Forces. Exemptions to this rule may be made in the case of officials of the Armed Forces to apply for the information to the Adjutant General or to the injury of the soldier.
3. Applications from individuals, other than historians and statisticians, for information from this statement of service should be denied and the application directed to the appropriate Government officials.
2. This statement is furnished primarily for historical and statistical purposes, although it may be used in adjudicating claims in which the State is solely concerned. It is not to be used before a court of justice or in support of any claim against the Federal Government, except to the furnishing of any information that may be used in the prosecution of a claim against the State in which the State is solely concerned. The law prohibits the furnishing of any information that may be used in the prosecution of a claim against the Federal Government.
