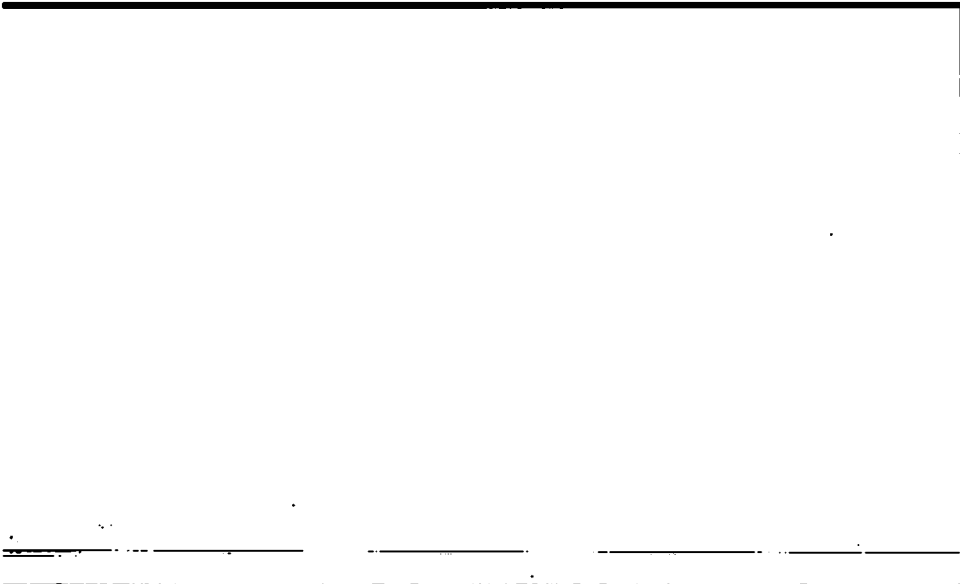
Chart showing back to school costs-Preddy
