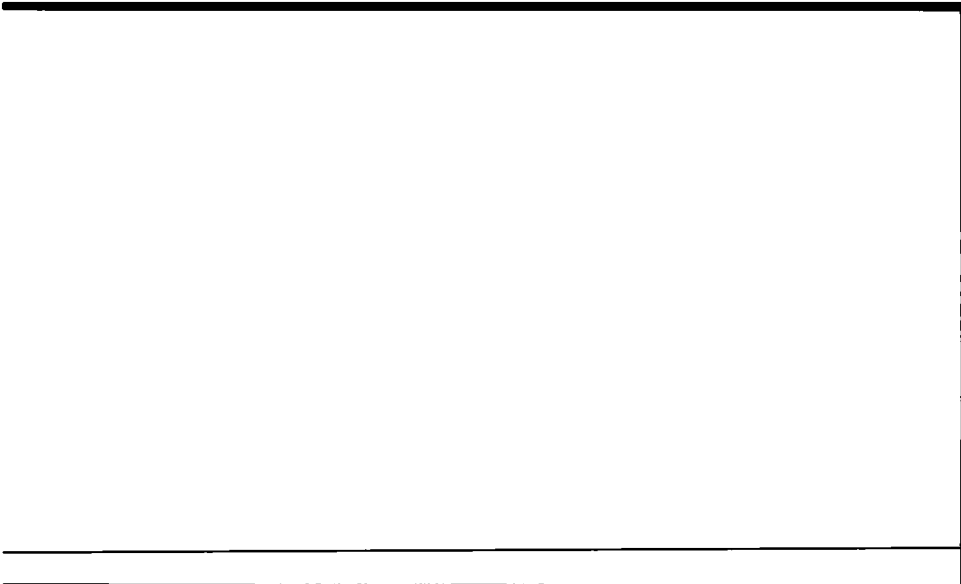

Chart of top 10 & bottom 10 states in federal per capita spending for the '95-'96 fiscal year

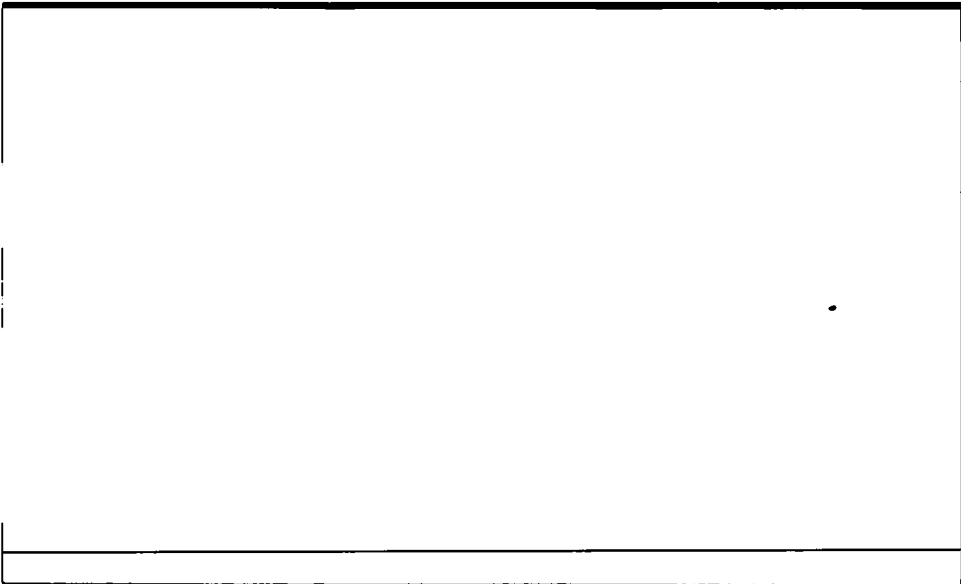

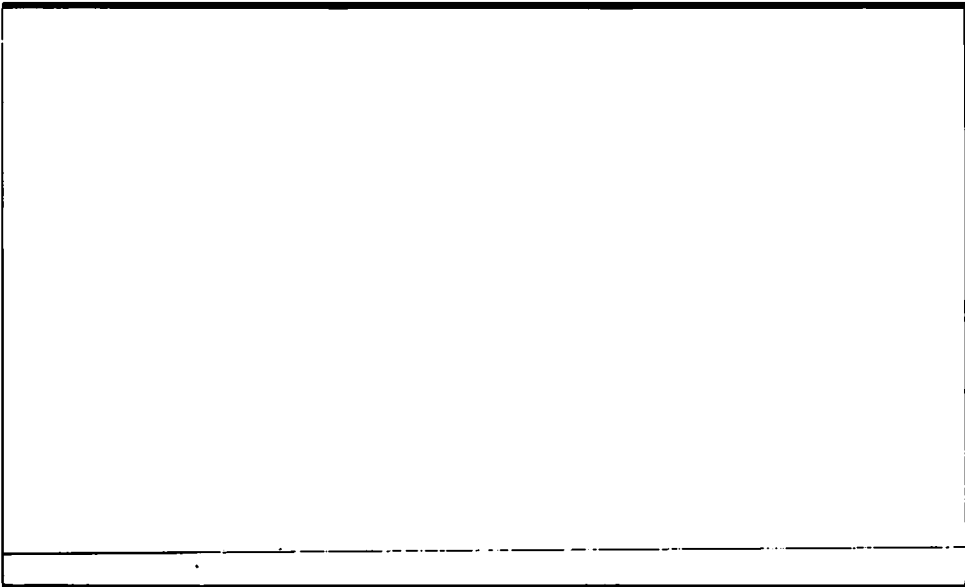
Fig. 1. Percentage of total catch versus number of hauls.
