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

6. Some enrollment papers show age at enlistment, while others show date of birth. The entries recorded herein are in the same service record with other records, except where an error or discrepancy is patent.

Except the data contained on the first four lines and that relating to battle casualties and physical disability, this statement is prepared as far as practicable from the service record, and no effort has been made to compare the data obtained from the service record with other records, except where an error or discrepancy is patent.
4. Except the data available to persons who might perpetrate fraud upon the Government, or who might seek to injure the soldier would be made available to persons who might perpetrate fraud, or access to, this statement of service, as otherwise information legally nontransferable soldier should be denied information from, or to the military and medical histories of the would be made available to persons who might perpetrate fraud upon the Government, or who might seek to injure the soldier.
3. 2. This statement is furnished primarily for historical and statistical purposes, although it may be used in adjudicating claims in which the State is solely concerned. It is not to be used before a court of justice or in support of any claim against the Federal Government. The law prohibits the furnishing of any information that may be used in the prosecution of a claim against the Government, except to the proper Government officials.
