1955 GAME BIRD COUNTS IN STATE GAME AREAS

METHOD:

Game bird counts have been made in May and early June for the past four years in southern Michigan state game areas. Starting one-half hour before sunrise an observer drives a route stopping to listen for four minutes at each designated listening station. Pheasant "crows" and ruffed grouse "drums" are counted during the first two minutes, and mental notes are made of individual doves and quail that are calling. During the final two minutes the number of individual grouse, doves and quail heard during the entire four minute period are estimated and recorded. Sight observations of game seen on the route are recorded also.

DISCUSSION:

Pheasant Populations

Crowing activity decreased slightly from 1954, indicating a rather thorough harvest of male pheasants on game areas.

The following compilation, based on game bird surveys of the past three seasons, rates game areas according to spring crowing activity:

Ruffed Grouse Populations

There has been little change in the number of drums per station during the four seasons for which we have data.

The better ruffed grouse areas include: Gratiot-Saginaw, Flat River, Lapeer, Stanton, Deford, Barry and Port Huron.

Dove Populations

Data for the past three seasons indicate no significant change in dove populations.

Quail Populations

Numbers of whistling quail heard per station have increased each season since counts were begun in 1952. Impressions gained from hearing and seeing quail while carrying out routine work on the game areas, also point to a gradual and constant increase in numbers since 1952.

During the past four seasons the highest quail populations have been found in the Dansville, Sharonville, Gregory, Waterloo, Pinckney and Petersburg areas. These areas are located in a relatively small region including southeastern Ingham, southwestern Livingston, eastern Jackson, western Washtenaw, and eastern Monroe counties. Although not included in game bird counts quail numbers in the Pittsford area, in Hillsdale County, compares favorably with the best quail areas. Areas north of the third tier of counties are definitely second-rate quail areas when compared with those mentioned above.
