

Per the Michigan Medical Marihuana Act, Initiated Law 1 of 2008, Section 6(i) requires the following statistical data be reported to the Legislature in an annual report. The statistical data for this program for Fiscal Year 2010 which is April 6, 2009 through September 30, 2009 is:

1. The number of applications filed for registry identification cards:

1,717

2. The number of qualifying patients and primary caregivers approved in each county.

County statistics are not available for the first fiscal year

3. The nature of the debilitating medical conditions of the qualifying patients.

Note: More than one condition may be listed for an individual patient so the total number of people with debilitating conditions totals is greater than the number of patients registered

4. The number of registry identification cards revoked.

Rule 25 of the General Rules states:

“A registered qualifying patient or registered primary caregiver who has been convicted of selling marihuana to someone who is not allowed to use marihuana for medical purposes under the act, shall have his or her registry identification card revoked “

One registry cards was revoked in FY 2009

5. The number of physicians providing written certifications for qualifying patients.

There were 249 physicians who issued certifications for patients in FY 09.
