The ground is coverd with snow but it look like it might set in to raining if it does it will soon go of. there is preaching at our school hous to morrow at ten oclock I have bin calculating to go but if it should be raining I mite not get to go

We have had no late news from Alvin but it is said that there is a going to be a thorough exchange of prisners all over we hope that he may get out soon for no doubt he is suffering every day

I have felt anxious to hear from DC and Andrew since that last fight there.

the papers say our loss was severe there as well as the rebbles Mc I am afraid the war is not over yet I beleive this great peace cry was just to fill up this last call for men

I have had no letter from Mich for some time but I have to or three from those that I neaver answerd so I cant expect to get letters if I doant answer them but I cant keep up with righting with all that I would tike to it is so expensive each letter costs six cents to for the paper and one for the envelop three postage since I am making nothing onely my bord for my work so I dont want to be to mutch expence for anything.
