Rifle River Area Deer Season 1964

Report 2466
December 16, 1964

This year there was an 18.4 per cent drop in the legal buck kill from the previous year. A total of 33 legal bucks were taken. In addition, 7 more adult bucks with sub-legal antlers (in the 1½-year class) were taken on special antlerless permits. The 33 legal bucks included 67 per cent in the 1½-year class. If the other 7 bucks (with sub-legal antlers) are included, then 72.4 per cent of the adult bucks were in the 1½-year class.

Those holding antlerless permits also took 39 adult does, 18 doe fawns, and 20 buck fawns. There were another 6 unclaimed deer located on the area during the hunting season. Only one of these animals was salvaged. A total of 117 deer were taken by hunters legally on the area. This was 4 less than the legal take in 1963.

Hunters from 36 counties and 3 other states used the Rifle River Area this season. There were only 63 fewer permits issued this year than last year. The buck kill by age groups was as follows:

The oldest buck taken was 3½ years old. The heaviest buck was a 3½-year-old, 10 point which weighed 147 pounds.

The average weight of bucks decreased this year. Many of the 1½-year-old bucks were less than 90 pounds in weight. All of the bucks with sub-legal antlers weighed less than 90 pounds and one 3½-year-old buck with a small deformed antler weighed 71 pounds. The average weight of buck fawns and adult does increased, but the weight of doe fawns decreased.

The weather in general was mild. Only on one day, November 22, did the temperature go below zero. High temperature was 52 degrees on November 16. There was a hard rain from 12 noon until about 2 p.m. on November 15, opening day. Seven-tenths of an inch fell during this time and helped to thin out some of the hunters. Nine days of the season had some snow on the ground, but there was never more than 2 to 3 inches on the ground at any one time.

On the first day of the season 670 permits were issued. Four hundred and twenty of these were issued by 7:45 a.m. No injuries were reported this year.

In general, there was very little unfavorable comment; as usual, as the season advanced and fewer deer were being seen, we had more disgruntled hunters. It should be noted that the total number of deer reported seen was down considerably from last year. There were 4,328 sightings in 1963 and 2,770 in 1964, a decrease of 1,558. A check was made in several areas during the last days of the season. Fresh tracks were numerous in areas checked.

It is recommended that the cutting program be continued according to the plans submitted by John Byelich and Allen Philbrick. This activity has been in a dormant condition and should be reactivated. Increased use of the crawler tractors equipped with cutting blades should be considered to knock down over-aged timber and timber of poor quality for which there is presently no demand. There are signs that deer are not browsing heavily on white pine. Young trees are getting ahead of the deer. This would be the time to do something about improving the timber stand.
