6. Some enlistment papers show age at enlistment, while others show date of birth. The entries recorded herein are in the same form as those on the enlistment paper. **5720**
5. Except the data contained on the first four lines and that relating to battle casualties and physical disability, this statement is predated as far as possible from the service record, and no effort has been made to compare the data obtained from the service record with other records, except where the error of discrepancy is patent. **5720**
4. Except as hereinbefore provided, all persons seeking information relative to the military and medical histories of the soldier should be denied information from, or access to, this statement, as otherwise information legally obtainable would be made available to persons who might get benefit therefrom, or who might seek to injure the soldier.
3. Applications from individuals, other than historians and statisticians, for information from this statement of service should be denied and the application directed to the Adjutant General. To the Adjutant General, who is the custodian of the official records of the Army, exceptions to this rule may be made in the case of officials of patriotic and philanthropic societies and associations which it is known positively that the information is to be used exclusively by said society or association, and will not be made public nor communicated to any individual who may use it directly or indirectly as a basis for, or in the prosecution of, a claim against the Government, or to the injury of the soldier.
2. This statement is furnished primarily for historical and statistical purposes, although it may be used in adjudicating claims in which the State is solely concerned. It is not to be used before a court of justice or in support of any claim against the Federal Government. The law prohibits the furnishing of any information that may be used in the prosecution of a claim against the Government, except to the proper Government officials.
