1. This statement is furnished primarily for historical purposes, although it may be used in adjusting claims in which the Federal Government. It is not to be used before a court of justice or in support of any claim against the Federal Government. The law prohibits the furnishing of any information that may be used in the prosecution of a claim against the Government, except to the proper Governmental officer.
2. This statement is furnished under the act of Congress approved July 11, 1913, as continued by act of Congress approved June 30, 1922.
3. Applications from individuals, other than historians and statisticians, for information from this statement should be denied and the applicant directed to the Army, who is the custodian of the official records of the Armies of the United States.
4. Except as hereinafter provided, all persons seeking information relative to the military and medical institutions of the service should be denied information from, or access to, this statement of service, as otherwise the information legally obtainable would be made available to persons who might perpetrate frauds upon the officers or the other members of the service.
