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MI School Data Report Updates

[College Enrollment by High School](#): Shows the number of Michigan public high school graduates who enrolled in a college or university. The report displays information by high school graduation year and shows how many Michigan students are going on to college, whether they are first enrolling in two-year or four-year institutions, and how soon they enroll after graduating from high school. This report has been updated with fall 2018 data and released to the public.

[College Enrollment Destination](#): Allows users to view the colleges in which students enrolled by graduation year and school or district. There are two trend views: "H.S. Graduation Year Trend" follows college enrollment across graduating classes, while "Enrollment Within Trend" follows the cumulative college enrollment of a specified graduating class for up to 48 months. This report has been updated with fall 2018 data and released to the public.

[Michigan Community College Data Inventory Report](#): Provides summary information about the activity, enrollment, resources and financial standing of state-supported community colleges. A downloadable file with 2017-18 data is publicly available.

[24 College Credits](#): Shows how long Michigan public high school graduates are taking to accumulate 24 college credits. The data can give insights on whether high school graduates are on track to earn a timely college degree and how well students are progressing. The report will be updated with "Time to Complete 24 Credits" data for graduation years 2016-17 and prior.

[College Enrollment by High School](#): Displays the number of Michigan public high school graduates who enrolled in a college or university. The report displays the information by high school graduation year and shows how many Michigan students are going on to college, whether they are first enrolling in two-year or four-year institutions, and how soon they enroll after graduating from high school. This report will be updated with "Time to Enrollment" data for graduation years 2016-17 and prior.

[College Enrollment Destination](#): Allows users to view the colleges and universities in which students enrolled by school or district, and by graduation year. Data can be displayed by students' initial college enrollments and by all college enrollments. This report will be updated with data for graduation years 2016-17 and prior.

[College Progression by Graduating Class](#): Shows how Michigan students are progressing in postsecondary education after high school graduation. The report can help people like counselors and administrators understand their graduates' college enrollment and how long it takes to earn a certificate or degree. This report will be updated with postsecondary school year data for graduation years 2016-17 and prior.

[College Remedial Coursework](#): Displays the number of Michigan public high school graduates who took at least one remedial course after enrolling in a Michigan college or university the year after high school graduation. This could be an indicator of college preparedness. This report will be updated with high school graduation year 2016-17 data.

[College Transfers](#): Provides transfer patterns, demographics and performance data for students who transferred into or out of a Michigan college or university. The data help users understand student transfer patterns and characteristics, including demographics and aggregate grade point averages earned after transferring. This report will be updated with 2017-18 school year data.

[College Undergraduate Enrollment](#): Offers a summary of undergraduate students enrolled at Michigan colleges and universities, searchable by college. The report offers a closer look into the colleges' and universities' undergraduate classes, providing details regarding the proportion of students attending with the intent of earning a college degree, student age, and whether the student graduated from a Michigan public high school the prior year. This report will be updated with 2017-18 school year data.
