was accepted for enlistment at Detroit, Mich. and enlisted
in the Nat'l Army at Columbus Bks. O. Oct. 6, 1917, giving his
residence as Eloise, Mich., sailed overseas Oct. 29, 1917 and
died aboard the U.S.S. Amemon, Nov. 12, 1917, as Pvt. Co A.
25 Engrs. On records prepared subsequent to enlistment this
soldiers residence was shown as Toronto, O. Statement of ser-
vice card has been furnished to the State of Michigan.
